
Soldier & Family Readiness Group (SFRG) Training July - December 2021

Readiness Essentials for Army Leaders (R.E.A.L.)

The following descriptions are specified training for...

SFRG Foundations: Designed to be a foundational course on Family Readiness and SFRGs. The information provides basic information on the different roles within the SFRG from the command team to the different volunteer positions. For the two part online SFRG Foundations training use the QR codes -

Command Teams: Designed to assist command teams with their responsibilities and roles by creating a Family Readiness Plan, distinguishing between Appropriated and SFRG Informal Funds.

Command Family Readiness Representatives (CFRR): Formerly known as Soldier & Family Readiness Liaison (SFRL). Designed to identify, define and understand SFRG operational components. Provide resources for volunteers and the membership, methods of communicating with SFRG membership, and how to execute their role within the SFRG.

SFRG Leaders: Identifies an SFRG's role in the Family Readiness Team. Understand and define the SFRG Mission Essential Activities. Learn how to execute the SFRG leader role by identifying methods of communicating with the SFRG membership and recognizing non-mission essential activities and resources that support a successful SFRG program. Key Contacts: Designed to provide training in roles and responsibilities, understanding available resources, and communicating with Family members while supporting a successful SFRG. Please apply for your volunteer position in VMIS prior to attending.

SFRG Informal Fund Custodians: Designed to gain clear understanding of authorized uses with SFRG informal funds in accordance with governing regulatory guidance. Define roles & responsibilities, installation policies, fundraising process, and mandatory requirements. Please apply for your volunteer position in VMIS prior to attending.
