Soldier and Family Readiness Group (SFRG) Class Descriptions

SFRG Leader/Co Leader Training:

This training is to identify the SFRG's role and gain a better understanding of the SFRG mission essential activities. Learn the SFRG leader role by identifying methods of communication with SFRG membership, recognize non-mission essential activities and resources and solving problems at the lowest level.

SFRG Informal Fund Custodian Training:

This training is required for all current and incoming SFRG Fund Custodians. The training provides an overview of the Army regulations governing management of SFRG informal funds and fundraising. Suggested training for SFRG Leaders, Commanders and SFRG Fundraising Coordinators.

SFRG Key Contact Training:

This training provides Key Contacts with an overview of their role and responsibilities as well as how to handle crisis phone calls. Required training for all SFRG Key Contacts and is a suggested training for all SFRG Coordinators. The course includes tips and techniques for executing the role as well as practical exercises and scenarios. Open to anyone wanting to learn more about the SFRG Communications Structure.

Command Family Readiness Representative Training (CFRR):

This training includes topics on understanding your role, resources for success and practical training in acting as extension of the unit. In this role, CFRRs act as an extension in providing official, accurate and command info in addition to advocating available resources and helping families solve problems at the lowest level. .

SFRG Family Readiness Advisor Training:

This training is designed to be a foundational course on Soldier & Family Readiness Groups. The training covers the Department of Defense definition of Soldier & Family Readiness and how the Army SFRG can assist commanders in meeting their mission of executing a unit Soldier & Family Readiness Program. The training provides basic information on the different roles within the SFRG from the command team to the various volunteer positions.

SFRG Commander Teams Training:

This training targets company commanders, but is also informative for brigade and battalion commanders and command sergeants major. This two-hour training delineates the roles and responsibilities of the command team regarding how to leverage the SFRG to execute the Soldier & Family Readiness mission. Topics include: Family Readiness, Mission Essential Tasks for SFRGs, SFRG Elements and Operations, Communications, Volunteer Management, SFRG Funding, and Resources.
