COMMAND TEAMS:

This course is designed primarily for Company Commanders, but is equally valuable for Brigade and Battalion Commanders. Participants will gain a clear understanding of executing their SFRG mission while in the role of the SFRG Leader. Training covers SFRG regulations, how to distinguish between mission and non-mission essential activities, strategies for effective volunteer recruitment, and practical steps for developing and carrying out a strong Family Readiness Plan. The training also emphasizes how to access support resources and problem-solving at the lowest level to build stronger, more resilient SFRGs.

COMMAND FAMILY READINESS REPRESENTATIVE (CFRR)

This required course prepares designated CFRRs to effectively serve as an extension to and provide direct representation of command team to the SFRG. Training is designed to help understand the operational, logistical and administrative aspects of the SFRG. Participants will learn their roles and responsibilities, how to provide official and accurate command information, and how to connect families with available resources. *This role should be filled by an active-duty officer or NCO with rank of E5 or above with at least 12 months of assignment remaining.*

INFORMAL FUNDS CUSTODIAN

This required course is designed for all current and incoming SFRG fund custodians. Through hands-on instruction, participants will learn the Army regulations and reporting requirements that govern the management of SFRG informal funds and fundraising activities. The training also provides valuable guidance for Commanders to better understand fund oversight and accountability. This role may not be filled by Commander, SGM, 1SG, CFRR, Contractor or SFRSA

KEY CONTACT

This course equips key contacts with a thorough understanding of their role and responsibilities within the SFRG. Participants will learn how to effectively manage phone calls, practice communication techniques, and apply tips and strategies through interactive exercises and real-world scenarios.

FAMILY READINESS ADVISOR

This course is designed to equip spouses or family member volunteers with a clear understanding of their role as the primary advisor to the unit commander on family readiness, unit climate and related issues. Participants will learn how to provide critical support at every echelon, from company level and above.
